
Carbon Counts sustainability & climate

- leave no-one behind being representative






New York CO₂ tonne bubbles (Climate Visuals, Creative Commons)

lt's now or never




- all issues are interlinked

Sustainably sustainable




- this is difficult, so how do we keep up momentum?
- teamwork, goals, commitment & mutual accountability
- create short, medium and long-term goals
- volunteers work on the action plans, only attempting what is practical and affordable
- participants have ownership of the program
- use recognised sports- and performance-based psychology to boost motivation and commitment

- product and material re-use & re-purposing
- recycling
- sharing ideas, time, resources, things
- better shopping and eating
- energy and water efficiency
- carbon footprint reduction
- caring for nature and the built environment
- involve local business and councils



Carbon Footprint Politics

Fact: everybody must reduce their carbon footprint We can only offload so much of the responsibility for our carbon footprint onto industry, the gov't and corporations

- even Big Oil makes adverts saying about reducing our carbon footprints, but it's still necessary
- all of society has to contribute
- the resistance and inertia are HUGE
- it takes just a few people to start and show how
- even our failure would be valuable as long as we can see where it goes wrong & how to correct it
- can we show it's worth it? Climate change as the alternative is looking increasingly scary



Measuring Progress

If you don't measure it, you can't manage it

We need to know how we are progressing, like weight-watchers count their calories

- like a bank account or calorie-controlled diet
- more detailed than less meat, cars & flying
- benchmark: average Londoner's carbon footprint
- goals: ideally we want results to rave about but we will only be doing what's feasible
- we are fundraising to build the technology: websites, databases and mobile apps
- we need to adopt more, different measures of sustainability, as well as CO₂



Collecting Carbon Footprint Data

Mathematical genius not essential, just a bit of dedication

Currently only governments and sustainability consultancies compile data on product-based CO₂ emissions

- we need to keep a tally of CO₂ emissions we cause
- mostly, we need to investigate to get the numbers
- weight-watchers have it easy the calories are on the label of everything we buy
- despite the planetary threat it causes, the emissions of most products & services are hidden



Diversity

Climate change impacts everyone

We want all sorts of people from all different backgrounds, a real cross-section of the community

- people from Islington, Hackney, Haringey, Camden
- all generations youth groups, workers, retirees
- students and schools, colleges and universities
- council estate tenants, home owners, renters
- churches, mosques, temples & synagogues
- local businesses & public bodies
- professionals, union members, entrepreneurs, volunteers, unpaid workers
- diversity is a catalyst for creativity

- set up more groups to replicate it
- participate in or even convene citizens' assemblies
